This Standard was prepared by the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee IT-019, Information and Documentation, Information Technology—Learning, Educations, Training and Research, to supersede, AS/NZS 2632.2:1999.

The objective of this Standard is to establish a universally applicable code for the representation of the names of principal administrative divisions of countries and territories included in AS/NZS 2632.1. It is intended to be used in conjunction with AS/NZS 2632.1, Codes for the representation of names of countries and their subdivisions, Part 1: Country codes.

This Standard is identical with, and has been reproduced from, ISO 3166-2:2007 Codes for the representation of names of countries and their subdivisions, Part 2: Country subdivision code.

As this Standard is reproduced from an International Standard, the following applies:

- (a) In the source text 'this part of ISO 3166' should read 'this part of AS/NZS 2632'.
- (b) A full point substitutes for a comma when referring to a decimal marker.

References to International Standards should be replaced by references to Australian or Australian/New Zealand Standards, as follows:
