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PREFACE

This interim Standard is identical with ISO/DIS 9000-2:1991, *Quality management and quality assurance Standards, Part 2: Generic guidelines for the application of ISO 9001, ISO 9002 and ISO 9003*, published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). It is issued as a joint interim Standard under the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding between Standards Australia and the Standards Association of New Zealand with the objective of reducing technical barriers to trade between the two nations.

The Australian Committee provided input to the International Committee ISO/TC 176 in the preparation of the draft ISO 9000-2. As publication of the draft ISO Standard is not imminent, the decision was jointly made by the Standards Association of New Zealand and Standards Australia to make the interim Standard available, in order to facilitate the usage of quality management systems within both countries.

For the purpose of this interim Australian/New Zealand Standard, the ISO text should be modified by replacement of references to other publications with references to Australian or New Zealand Standards.
